## Council

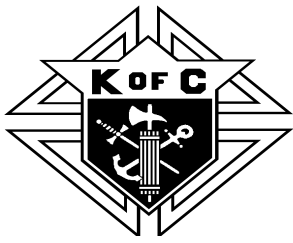

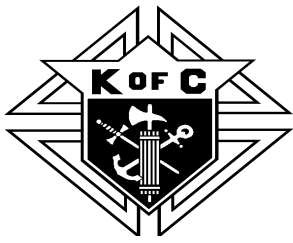

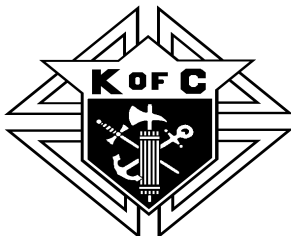
## MARCH FOR LIFE 2008

## NISSAN

A big thank you goes to those who have volunteered for your hard work – we have made a good effort in providing funds for council activities. We earned a total of \$5,045.14 for the season from 11 shows and had a great time at the Worker's Appreciation Dinner.

Through feedback and emails we learned that those groups that worked all 17 shows this year received an extra bonus at year end. Additionally, though the number of Nissan concerts held were down in 2007, Aramark did enjoy quite a few successes:

- Aramark's per capita, or sales per person, was up by over 10% vs. 2006.

- The lemonade stands average sales were up 43% vs. 2006.
- With the addition of the beer walls and wheelbarrows on the hill we were able to grow the per capita spending by 26% overall and some shows by well over 100% vs. same shows in 2006.
- Aramark successfully took over operating the specialty food locations.
- Aramark also took back the VIP food program.
